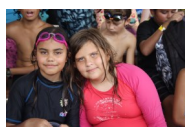

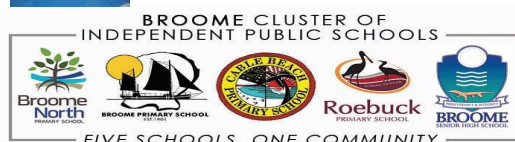

This term in maths we have been learning lots! I mean do you know how to add and subtract decimals, or do you know what a prime or composite number is?

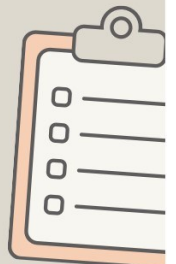
### Prime and Composite numbers
